

ABOUT US

The Human Equity, Access, and Relations (HEAR) Commission was established in October, 2020 by the City of San Gabriel. The Commission served as an advisory board to the City Council and was charged with promoting equity, access, and community engagement.

San Gabriel is a "majority-minority" city with 63% of the 40,000 residents identifying as Asian or 25% Latino. Advising and advocating for ways to celebrate and facilitate respect for that diversity was a major focus of HEAR.

One of the first tasks of the commission was to complete a community needs survey. Mental health services were the leading request. To address this need, HEAR developed the first ever city hosted Mental Wellness Expo in 2022. In 2023, we dreamed of expanding our reach and making the resources more accessible and inclusive for our city's population. Our Healthy Living Grant proposal was funding to offer 4 educational workshops that addressed the signs of depression and anxiety, suicide prevention, combating the effects of social isolation and positive parenting, with simultaneous translation into Mandarin and Spanish.

Participants will gain an understanding of childhood development for adolescents, parenting techniques, and symptoms of childhood behavioral disorders.


Question, Persuade, and Refer – 3 steps that can save a life. Learn how to recognize the warning signs of suicide, ask about suicidal ideation, persuade someone to seek help, and refer them to the appropriate mental health resources

Defining Loneliness & Creating Connections – Special Services Group

Participants will learn the signs and symptoms of loneliness, who is vulnerable, when it should be addressed, and strategies to build social connections.

Understanding Depression & Growing Resilience - LA County Dept of Mental Health

Participants will learn to recognize the difference between sadness and clinical depression, how culture influences depression, and learn how to promote resilience.









WHAT COMES NEXT?

- The race and ethnicities of participants at the MWE were in line with our city's population. Translation services were helpful to over 50%. *Removing language* as a barrier to engagement in services is key.
- In 3 years, the work of HEAR has led to the City of San Gabriel investing in a full-time Case Manager position as part of Community Services.
- Despite the commission's crucial efforts and successes, on April 16th, the San Gabriel City Council voted to dissolve the HEAR Commission after a proposal for a LGBTQ+ public safety initiative was recommended.
